

Big Idea:

Thought Exercise:

Love one another; the repeated command of God

- What does it say when a command is given over fifty times?
- Compare this with the other "one another" commands.
- What are some things that have influence over our ability to love one another?
- Take time to imagine what it might look like if our love for one another was our primary identity.

- Life is busy and hectic by nature. How can our love for the church community work in the middle of the busyness?
